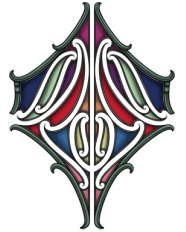

Settler Day

On Monday, 8 June, we will be holding **Settler Day**, during which students will learn about a significant period in New Zealand's history when European settlers first arrived and established communities.

Students are invited to dress in clothing that reflects this historical period. In the afternoon, we will also be running a **Trading Shop** activity. If your child has items they no longer use or need—such as toys, books, or clothing they have outgrown—they are welcome to bring them along to trade and barter with other students.

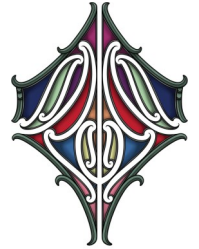

Seniors:

This week in maths we've been refining our rounding skills! We have practiced rounding to the tens, hundreds, and thousands places (some of us have even extended that to larger places!). We have used rhymes, number lines and rounding frames to help us gain confidence.

In literacy this week we continued reading the African folktale, *Mufaro's Beautiful Daughters*, and then compared it to the folktale, *The Fisherman and His Wife*. We looked at the theme of both stories, and discussed how the purpose and style of each story is different. We will continue reading *The Fisherman and His Wife* and some accompanying texts next week.

During topic time, we discussed last week's static electricity lab and learned that objects can become positively or negatively charged. Students had some good connections to times they've seen static electricity, including lightning! We also had a day of printmaking with polystyrene and made some beautiful prints. We are exploring how to make a depression in order to create our design and will be starting to work with lino next week to create our final art piece.

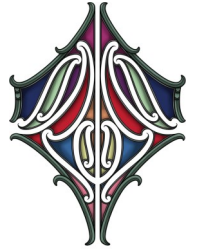
